

BOROUGH OF LYME REGIS.

Standing Orders of the Council of the said Borough.

1. February 15, 1836. That upon the application of any Member of the Council to Register the Votes of Members voting on any question in the Minutes of the Council, the Votes be so Registered.
 2. March 14, 1836. That a separate Letter Book, containing all Letters, Written Communications, and Notices sent and served by the Town Clerk, by order of the Council be kept by the Town Clerk.
 3. November 13, 1837. That on the Sunday next following the future Elections of Mayor, the Council attend him to Church, and that they also attend him to Church in Procession on the Sunday previous to the other Quarterly Meetings of the Council. For the sake of order and regularity it was ordered that an arrangement of the Procession and of the Seats in Church be previously prepared.
 4. April 5, 1847. That the Trawling Vessels belonging to this Port be required to expose their Fish for Sale in the Fish Market, between the hours of 6 & 9 in the Summer months, and 8 & 4 in the Winter, and that, unless this order be complied with, the Collector be directed to collect the Dues under the Cobb Act.
 5. June 20, 1864. That no book or paper be taken from the Muniment Room, unless by permission of the Mayor and Council, and an acknowledgment of the Receipt of the same entered into a book to be provided for that purpose, and signed by the Borrower, and countersigned by the Town Clerk.
 6. September 21, 1874. That the Town Crier shall not cry anything which has not been duly authenticated by the name of some responsible person.
 7. December 21, 1903. That the Mayor be considered, ex-officio, a Member of all Committees.
 8. That all matters relating to the Finances of the Borough be first discussed in Committee.
 9. That the Mayor be empowered to expend in Repairs, or otherwise, at his discretion, during the intervals of the meetings of the Council, any sum not exceeding £5, such sum so expended by him to be submitted to the Council at their next meeting, and repaid.
 10. That no Bills be paid until they have been examined and endorsed by the Finance Committee, except for Wages, or Contracts.
 11. That all Lettings of Property belonging to the Corporation, be by Tender.
 12. That the Fines for non-acceptance, or resignation after acceptance of Corporate Offices within this Borough be fixed at Thirty Pounds in the case of Mayor, Ten Pounds in the case of Aldermen, and Two Pounds in the case of Councillors and Auditors.
- That the Standing Orders as now produced be adopted, and that the same be printed, and a copy hung up in the Guild Hall, and that no such Order be rescinded or altered, except at a Meeting called for that purpose.
